Question #1/ Response #1

Q: I noticed that the department is requesting a quote with SPO2 on the device. They did not mention SPCO. This is a huge advantage to them as they upgrade their devices. Do you want to check with Assistant Chief Asper if this was an oversight? I don't want to bid it as there is an upcharge but if this is what they want I want to make sure that they get it.

R: This is not an oversight. The bid price should only reflect having SPO2 on the device. The department is not interested in SPCO at this time.

Question #2/Response #2

Q: Also they did not mention chargers for the Cardiac monitors and how many they would need.

R: The Urbana Fire Division (City of Urbana) owns a total of three medic units and is planning to purchase one (1) cardiac monitor for each medic unit for a total of three (3) cardiac monitors. Each monitor shall have the capability to be plugged in and charged while in use within the medic unit. In addition, one (1) charger (charging unit) is needed back on station for charging battery packs that are used for cardiac monitors. A bid price shall be provided for this charger, and an updated bid form has been included with this addendum. This revised bid form shall supersede the previous version.

Question #3/Response #3

Q: Is the bid opening at 2:00PM on the 12th of October? It states that they have to be received by then, but doesn't state that they will be opened then.

R: Bids are due by 2:00PM on Friday, October 12, 2018 to the City of Urbana Finance Office, 205 South Main Street, Urbana, OH 43078. All bids received by the deadline on that date will be opened immediately after the bids are closed in
