# Residential Recycling Services and City Facility Solid Waste Collection and Disposal Addendum #2

Alternate Bid Evaluation; Alternate #6 Changes

#### **Bid Date and Time**

The bid date and time is hereby changed in the bid documents, including the advertisement for bids to 11:00AM on Thursday, June 22, 2017 at which time bids will be publicly opened and read aloud. This change to the bid date and time shall supersede any previous change to the bid date and time.

### Alternates #1 and #2-Residential Solid Waste Collection-Q & A

Q1: If alternate bid #1 or #2 is chosen, would either of these options require implementation by 9/1/2017?

A1: If either of these options were chosen, an implementation period would be required, including passage of a city ordinance to require that all residential units participate in the city's solid waste collection program. Implementation would extend past 9/1/2017 if either alternate #1 or #2 was accepted and implemented. At the present time, the city anticipates that the curbside recycling program will be maintained, but the program will probably not be expanded to incorporate solid waste. Alternates #1 and #2 are mainly an effort on the city's part to understand the marketplace for solid waste collection if the city moved to one single hauler for solid waste collection.

Q2: Any idea about the current tonnage that is being amassed for residential collection in Urbana?

A2: At present, there are at least three vendors providing residential solid waste collection in the city. As a result, the city does not have any tonnage information available. This tonnage may be available through the North Central Ohio Solid

Waste District. Presently, Waste Management, Rumpke, and Roberts Refuse Service provide residential solid waste collection services in Urbana on a subscription basis.

Q3: Would the households be limited to cart only collection or would people be able to set out more waste?

A3: Households would be limited to cart only collection if alternate #1 or #2 was accepted.

Q4: What are the parameters for large item collection?

A4: Households would be allowed up to one large item to be collected per month if arranged through the city's Utility Billing Office and placed curbside for collection in accordance with the selected contractor's guidelines.

Q5: Is there a thought or discussion regarding education of residents as this could be a major change?

A5: If either alternate #1 or #2 was accepted and implemented, the city realizes that this change would be substantial, and it would require an educational effort by the city, solid waste district, and the selected contractor. Furthermore, the city realizes that education would be required as part of the extended implementation process required if one of these options is accepted.

Q6: Would this program be an all inclusive deal or would residents be able to opt out?

A6: If either alternate #1 or #2 was accepted and implemented, a city ordinance to require that all residential units (single family homes and duplexes) participate in the city's solid waste collection program would need to be passed. If either alternate #1 or #2 was accepted, as required by the ordinance, all billing would be handled through the city on the city utility bill with the contractor providing the solid waste collection service as a city contractor to all residential units (single family homes and duplexes).

#### Carts and Bins (Q & A)

Q1: Looking at the spec, is there any way that we can submit a bid based on the status quo? This would be a mix of bins and carts.

A1: For clarification, the two-day and one-day single stream collection options in the base bid that include 18 gallon containers furnished by the city are the status quo options. The intent would be to continue to use a combination of 18 gallon containers (bins) furnished by the city and 64 gallon carts furnished by the contractor.

For clarification, the bid form has been updated as part of this addendum to reflect the combination of container sizes envisioned for these options. The bid form included with this addendum shall supersede any previous version.

Q2: How many people have carts currently?

A2: The current contractor provides one 64 gallon cart to residents who opt to call the contractor and request the delivery of a cart.

In addition, for no additional charge, the contractor provides one 64 gallon cart to subscribers to the commercial establishment recycling program. If a commercial establishment requires additional carts, the carts are billed by the city to the commercial establishment at a monthly rental per cart of \$2.00 per month, and this fee is paid directly to the contractor for furnishing the cart.

Presently, the current contractor has estimated that approximately 40% of the residential units in the city are utilizing a cart provided by the contractor.

In addition, there are approximately 14 commercial establishments who are currently utilizing carts for that program.

# Waste Water Treatment Plant Collection (Q & A)

Q1: How often are the dumpsters picked up at the water treatment plant?

A1: For clarification, there are five 3 yard dumpsters at this facility at 1263 Muzzy Road. These dumpsters are emptied twice per week on Mondays and Thursdays. This count of dumpsters shall supersede the previous counts identified within the bid documents.

Q2: Is the grit screening put in the dumpsters or dumped out of the 95 gallon carts?

A2: The grit screenings are placed directly into the 96 gallon carts, and the staff at the facility rotates these carts out for collection. The carts are directly emptied into the collection vehicle by the contractor at a designated location at the facility. At any given time, the carts are being rotated between the plant operation itself and the designated pickup location. There are an estimated twenty 96 gallon carts furnished by the contractor in use throughout this facility. Furthermore, the carts are only emptied by the contractor one day per week on Thursdays.

# **Current Rate Charged/City Facility Billing (Q & A)**

Q1: What is current rate being billed by Waste Management?

A1: Presently, all residential units as defined in the bid documents are charged \$3.18 per month on their city utility bill for recycling service. Furthermore, subscribers to the commercial establishment recycling program are charged \$3.18 per month on their city utility bill. These collected funds are then deposited into a city fund that is used to pay the recycling contractor.

The selected contractor shall be permitted to bill for 3,654 Residential Units at the monthly rate per unit for the length of the contract.

Q2: Are city service buildings part of the current contract? If so, is the billing to residents covering that cost?

A2: Yes, these Municipal Facilities are being serviced, including solid waste collection and disposal at no charge by the incumbent recycling contractor as noted under paragraph #9 in the instructions to bidders. The present contractor is absorbing this cost into the \$3.18 fee per residential unit that is being charged for the collection, transportation, and processing of recyclable materials.

# **Alternate Bid Evaluation**

Bidders shall reserve the right to not provide a bid for any of the alternate options without an impact to the evaluation of their base bid proposals.

#### Alternate #6 Changes

Alternate #6 shall be revised to reflect the use of only paper yard waste bags. In addition, the proposed program shall be revised to reflect one leaf pickup in mid-November and another leaf pickup in early-December. The bid form has been revised accordingly and included with this addendum. This revised bid form shall supersede any previous version.

The current estimated number of qualifying Residential Units is 3,654. The Bidder has reviewed the City and Champaign County tax record and based its bid on \_\_\_\_\_\_ Residential Units which is close to the estimated 3,654 Residential Units.
